## THE HOLLENBECK FAMILY

### Finding Strength Through Connections



When Cassie and Nate Hollenbeck learned their unborn daughter Raya had Trisomy 18, a rare genetic condition, doctors offered little hope. But Cassie wasn't ready to give up. She found a care team at University of Michigan Health C.S. Mott Children's Hospital willing to fight for Raya's life.

Raya was born on October 4, 2024, and spent 143 days in the hospital. She underwent heart surgery and received a G-tube, while also battling severe bronchomalacia (a condition that made it difficult for Raya to breathe). Through it all, Raya's resilience amazed everyone, and today she continues to grow stronger with ongoing therapy and expert care.



Haven & Kennedy

During those long months, the Ronald McDonald House in Ann Arbor became home for the Hollenbeck family. Cassie, Nate, and big sister Haven spent 139 nights just steps away from Raya's hospital room. More than a place to stay, the House was a village that offered meals, play spaces, and support, allowing the family to be together during such a difficult time.

Haven especially thrived in the community. She made herself at home in the playroom and joined in special programs like music therapy, therapy dog visits, and bingo nights. Most importantly, she met Kennedy, another big sister whose sibling also has Trisomy 18. The two became inseparable, sharing playtime and crafts while their parents found comfort in a bond of shared understanding.

**Cassie reflects on the impact: "The House gave us more than a place to sleep—it gave us people who understood us, friendships that lifted us up, and a community that carried us through."**

Today, Raya continues to defy expectations. For the Hollenbecks, RMHC Ann Arbor will always be where they found stability, strength, and connection during their hardest days.

# RMHCAA 40 & FABULOUS!



1984

A groundbreaking ceremony was held for the new Ronald McDonald House in Ann Arbor. Families helped put the first shovels in the ground along with U-M President Dr. Harold Shapiro, U-M Vice President of Medical Affairs Dr. Robert Kelch, Ann Arbor Mayor Lou Belcher, and Detroit Tiger baseball players Darrell Evans, Lance Parrish, and Larry Herndon.

1985

With the leadership from the Junior Service League of Ann Arbor, Ronald McDonald House Ann Arbor opens its doors to become a "home away from home" for families caring for a hospitalized child.

1992

New "Friends Wing" opens to accommodate six more families for a total of up to 29 a night. The new wing was funded by a \$500,000 gift from the Friends of the University of Michigan Hospitals and a match gift by individual donors and organizations.

2011

In 2011, "The House Within the Hospital," known as the Mott House, opened on the 10<sup>th</sup> floor of the new C.S. Mott Children's Hospital next to the ICU. With 12 rooms, the House serves families of the most critically ill children.

2018

Two more rooms are added to the Main House for a total of 31 rooms.

We launched our Hospitality Cart program to provide comfort care items to families at the hospital.

2025

As we reflect on our 40<sup>th</sup> year, we are grateful to have fulfilled our goal of keeping families close and look to the future of serving even more families!

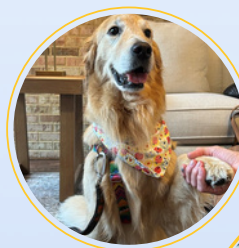
## Red, White, & Cool 4<sup>th</sup> of July
